Role of Registered Nurse (RN) in the Management of Patients Receiving Moderate Sedation/Analgesia for Therapeutic, Diagnostic, or Surgical Procedures. Administration of moderate sedation/analgesia medications by non-anesthetist RNs is allowed by state laws and institutional policy, procedures, and protocol.
